The House

Built in the 1930's, our house has character and provides a great place to call home. The house provides a great feeling of community, all while taking it easy on your wallet. In fact, our fees are less expensive than downtown apartments and on-campus housing. We have plenty of rooms for studying, socializing, and living.

At Theta Chi Fraternity, we pride ourselves in affirming the values you have instilled in your son over the years, and in helping him to develop into a strong leader for his campus and community. We take seriously our role in supporting your son's development. We offer guidance to help our members set goals, establish best practices, and provide supportive oversight in sensitive cases.

As a parent of a college student, you have enough worries on your mind. Will my son be happy? Did we make the right choice with Penn State? Will he eat properly? We are here to help ease these worries as you and your son make the transition into college life. We like to think of our chapter as an extension of your home.

Yes, I would be remiss to ignore the news stories of hazing, binge drinking deaths, and other debauchery that proliferate the media. Sadly, this is the only news that you typically hear about modern day fraternity life. Let me assure you that the men of Theta Chi Fraternity take no part in such dangerous activities.

We focus on our principals of Brotherhood, Scholarship, Service, and Character - upon which our fraternity was founded on April 10, 1856.

Brotherhood – Theta Chi takes pride in having a tightly knit brotherhood. We develop great friendships by working on numerous projects throughout the year, notably Homecoming (the chapter won Homecoming overall in 2007 and 2008). While we are NOT a “house,” our home at 523 South Allen Street provides a beautiful, safe, and fun environment to develop this sense of brotherhood.

Scholarship: Both the undergraduate and alumni leadership expect academic excellence. In the 2011 Spring semester, our fraternity finished with a cumulative average of 3.22, boasting a GPA above the all men's average. Over the last five years, the chapter has consistently been in the top 10 academically of all fraternities. A scholarship chair works to develop study hours and academic initiatives of all members. The brotherhood also works together to provide guidance, advice, and study help. Our house is an alcohol-free living facility that provides for a more suitable learning experience.

Service: Theta Chi Fraternity believes that service to others makes our members stronger, both in character and in compassion. We are committed to making our community a better place to live. The undergraduate brothers participate in numerous philanthropic activities. Furthermore, Theta Chi sponsors a major campus event each year that raises thousands of dollars for Make-A-Wish Foundation.

Character: Theta Chi has a no-hazing policy. We believe in developing character the right way. While overcoming challenges are a critical piece of you son's development, this will not take the shape of any mental, psychological, or physical hazing at Theta Chi. We have a structured 8-10 week new member education program where all new members learn about the principals and history of Theta Chi as well as the leadership and academic skills required in order to become an active member.

I know that Theta Chi at Penn State will provide your son with one of the most positive developmental and learning experiences in his college years.
